

Astronomía Inclusiva



Barriers in science for people with disabilities

- Mainly visual representations.
- Lack of sign language signs for technical terms.
- Physical barriers to access labs and science buildings.
- High productivity standard.
- Prejudices.



Accessibility must be addressed at all levels

- Outreach
- Education
- Research

Work on motivation

Tough audience?
Not really, only less easy than normal (in Chile)

- Visually impaired people: Less exposed to astronomical images
- Hearing impaired people: not used to have sign language interpretation on talks
- · Just as curious as anyone.

Need to collaborate

- With communities of people with disabilities
- Schools: Teachers, disability experts, parents, etc.
- Artists, designers, other scientists, etc.



More adaptability, less perfectionism Let's allow ourselves to fail.




Make us to start from scratch


"multimodal stimulus in synchrony with the sound helps space scientists identify events masked by noise in 2D data"

- Afterglow Access (IDATA, High school level)




